What is the fund about?

Community impact.

Supporting tamariki / children, rangatahi / young people and their whānau / families. Supporting social services which support whānau / families. 'A hand up not a hand out.'

What vision does the fund support?

Tamariki / children, rangatahi / young people and their whānau / families are resilient, secure and thriving. Our work prioritises whānau / families who experience multiple and intergenerational disadvantage.

Who is eligible?

Groups or individuals who organise initiatives and activities across the Wairarapa and Tararua regions. These may be grass roots, small or large organisations that make a big difference in their community. Organisations that support activities for:

- Family
- Children, young people, related to identity and belonging
- Māori led

What is funded?

The funding may be used for whanau support in:

- Early years activities
- Youth development
- Māori initiatives
- Migrant, refugees & cross cultural projects
- Literacy and Numeracy
- Budgeting
- Community services and development

The grant amount that can be granted for a single applicant: \$500-\$15,000 annually for up to 3 years

What is not funded?

Funding may not be used for:

- Projects that are part of core governmental funding (ie Govt already fund them)
- health
- disability
- core education
- sport & recreation
- drama / art / performing arts

How to apply?

Contact Kerri at Tararua REAP for an application form. Complete it fully and return before deadline. Applications close around Mid October each year, allocation is early November. Reports are due Early May the following year.
